# 1) Call to order

- a) Welcome and Introductions
- b) Review and approve Nov meeting minutes

## 2) Reports

- a) Treasurer
  - i. Current Totals. \$2738.61 in general funds. \$344.09 in Animal Care funds.
  - Run for the Raptors. Currently at a loss of \$76.80. We spent \$330.00 on shirts and \$31.80 on popcorn. I have received a \$250.00 donation & \$35.00 in late registrations. The recdesk registrations & popcorn sales have not yet been received.
  - iii. Duck Hunt. Currently at a loss of \$\$141.48. We spent \$301.48 on supplies (some of which can be reused for future events). I have received \$50.00 in late registrations and \$30.00 for popcorn sales. The RecDesk registrations have not yet been received.
  - iv. **Aquarium Purchase**. Spent \$300.00 on an aquarium for a diamondback terrapin. As we took this to a vote on this purchase, I took it from the general fund and not Animal Care, as we reserved that for emergencies & small purchases.
    - i. <u>Question: Do we need an alternate method for urgent purchases over \$100? Are we all OK doing</u> <u>a vote by email like we did for larger purchases on short notice?</u> This topic was tabled for discussion during the next meeting.
  - v. Animal Care. Spent \$108.46. Purchased multiple sharps disposal boxes due to issues with disposal of used needles from animal injections (\$14.47). Purchased a solar fountain/bird bath for the raptors (\$12.99). Had another vet visit for a turtle (\$81.00).
  - vi. **Misc. Purchases.** Replaced the clever catch Insect facts ball used for events. Purchased 2 for \$42.38. Purchased a display stand for flyers (\$36.02).
- vii. **Donations & Sales.** \$220.00 for Animal care. \$13.25 from fish food. \$73.00 from Maple Syrup sales. \$88.00 in the Donation box.
