Fund Report

- We have \$8,459.91 in total funds.
- Since our last meeting we received \$630.00 from CCRP for Membership fees, and \$616.00 for Adult Egg Hunt Proceeds. We spent \$301.90 on an eagle scale.

Astro Turf

 I have called Coppermine twice to inquire about turf scraps, leaving messages both times. I have yet to receive a response.

Reimbursement Checks

The US Post Office is reporting exceptionally high loss of mail, as well as increased check theft and forgery as a result. Because of this, I will no longer be delivering reimbursement checks by mail. I propose that all such reimbursement checks will be brought to the Bear Branch Nature center to be held by Jenna. They could then be picked up during normal park hours or at our monthly meetings.

Other notes: Budget

- Following the discussion of an "Advertising Budget", I have broken our money into six funds; Advertising, Animal Care, Events, Garden, Merchandise, and the General Fund.
- Previously we took money from the General Fund to support the Garden Fund.
- With the start of the new fiscal year, I would like to codify this process and allot annual budgets for both the Garden and Advertising Funds.
- The Garden Fund will continue to be supported by the General Fund, while the Advertising budget will be supported from the Events Fund.
- The other funds are currently self-sustaining with dedicated animal care donations, event proceeds, merchandise sales, and general donations. At this time I see no reason to dedicate specific yearly budgets for them.

- For advertising, we have already spent \$739.40 on advertising since September 2022. I would like to allocate funding from the Events fund to cover that, plus an additional annual budget of \$1,000.00, for a total of \$1,739.40. This would cover items such as our website, banners, stickers, and event sponsorships such as Hill Yeah.
 - Won't advertise our big events that sell out like Egg Hunt and Duck Hunt
 - Will advertise smaller events, investing in getting people to come out like Earth Day, Raptor Romp, MapleFest
 - \$200 website, \$200 SM advertising, HillYeah sponsorship
- For the Garden Fund, we have spent \$434.74 since August 2022, with \$315.26 of the original \$750.00 investment remaining. I would like to add an additional \$200.00 for an annual budget of \$500.00 (plus the \$15.26 in carry over funding).
- While our Merchandise Fund should be self-sufficient, it is currently operating at a deficit of \$1,083.12. We have \$1,799.00 in Maple Syrup inventory and an estimate of \$1,025.00 in clothing inventory (clothing audit in progress). I would like to sell enough Merchandise to turn a profit before purchasing any additional items. Given our current rate of sale, this proposal could impact Maple Syrup purchases for Maple Fest 2024.
- In a post general meeting budget discussion with Michelle, Chris, Rachel, Rob and Maggie, it was decided to start the 2023/24 advertising budget at \$800 instead of \$1000. Everything else mentioned above stayed the same.
